#### **OCConnect**

On **Tuesday 20th & Wednesday 21st June**, the Connecting Community for Kids Backbone and JLT Co-chairs attended OCConnect in Melbourne, Opportunity Child's annual Conference. This was a fantastic opportunity to bring collective impact initiatives from around Australia together in one room, and hear their stories. Logan Together, The Hive, Mt Druitt, Sanderson Alliance, Go Goldfields and Together in the South all shared their successes, trials and tribulations of engaging with the community, ensuring the right data is collated, collectively identifying the key issues and then pursuing community energy to create circuit breakers for change.

One of the most valuable lessons learned was to ensure you know your community and what interests them. Go to where your community is and be authentic. Fred Chaney's closing words on Tuesday's session; heartedly expressing the importance of exposing people to the reality to entice drive and passion has resonated with the team at Connecting Community for Kids, and will be forever in our minds as we move forward in finding the 'sweet spot' of community life. # **Little Peeps Ball**

On Wednesday 28th June, City of Kwinana hosted its Little Peeps Ball, with the assistance of local service providers. Connecting Community for Kids contributed catering and event assistance for the evening; where over 200 children from all cultures got to boogie the night away with a DJ blasting disco tunes. All attendees received a lolly bag and book donated by Paint Kwinana REaD. The Little Peeps Ball is held annually during NAIDOC Week to help celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children aged 0-11.

## **Community Workshops**

On **Monday 24th July** we finalised our series of Community Workshops, inviting members of our JLT, Decision Making Groups and additional service providers and community members in both Cockburn and Kwinana to come along and brainstorm our four focus areas impacting childhood development. This final workshop investigated the influence of **Financial Strain** on children with some fantastic feedback.

Six community members, 3 service providers and 2 JLT members joined forces and were asked to brainstorm 'what would it take to reduce the impact of financial strain on young children and enable them to thrive?' Although a small group, conversation was passionate and many ideas were presented in how to improve outcomes for children. Again, the importance of community



and neighbourhood connectivity was raised and the need for parents and carers to receive information on what assistance is available.


connection to family and customs and offers the opportunity to celebrate the strengths and culture of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children.
