Role Overview

The Connecting Community for Kids community mothers program is a unique volunteering opportunity for women who are passionate about improving the well-being of new mothers in the local community. Our volunteers are mothers, or experienced care givers, who are willing to offer non-judgemental and confidential support to new mothers on a monthly basis.

The community mother will be matched with a new or expectant mother and will build a trusting relationship, visiting them at home and spending time getting to know them and their families. The community mother supports her in her parenting role and assists in connecting her to the community, encouraging access to health services, parenting services and community groups.

Organisation Purpose

To improve the wellbeing and development of children and families across Cockburn and Kwinana by working collaboratively to drive change. Building community capacity and supporting sustainability to ensure continuous improvements.

Position Requirements

- Attend a compulsory two-day training course facilitated by Curtin University School of Nursing and delivered in the City of Cockburn or the City of Kwinana
- Commitment to five hours per month (per family). This is broken down as:
 - One-on-one meeting with recipient mum one hour / month
 - Travel and preparation for visit (may need to visit Connecting Community for Kids to collect resources as required) – one hour / month
 - o Mentoring session at Curtin University three hours / month
- Attend a compulsory two-day training course facilitated by Curtin University School of Nursing and delivered in the City of Cockburn or the City of Kwinana
- Develop a supportive non-judgemental relationship with your nominated recipient
- Connect the recipient to any community groups, parenting services or health services as required
- Adhere to all Connecting Community for Kids policies

Selection Criteria

- A willingness to embrace the mission and values of Connecting Community for Kids
- Experience in a parenting role and knowledge of child development
- Capacity to work effectively as part of a team
- Ability to obtain a working with children check and national police clearance check
- Empathic, reliable and caring
- Good communication and listening skills
