Working in and with the Cockburn community the Connecting Community for Kids collective impact initiative is focused on 4 community identified priorities.





AS A RESULT OF THE SUPPORT RECEIVED PARENTS IN COCKBURN REPORT:



This report card is a collated summary from Joint Leadership partners answering the broad question "How many different families used these types of services during this period". The focus is activities that relate most directly to the overarching CCK goals and partnerships. Not all services and programs delivered by the provider are included and the data may not align with other activity reports of each individual service.

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EARS2LEARN

In December we congratulated 9 amazing ladies for reaching competency to provide ear screening for children. Ear Screening, under the Ears2Learn program, is available at Goodstart Early Learning Centres in Cockburn, Success, Bertram and Atwell as well Bright Futures in Kwinana and Babbingur Mia in Rockingham. Ears2Learn is a partnership between Connecting Community for Kids, Earbus Foundation of WA, Goodstart Early Learning and The Smith Family providing children aged 0 – 5 years ear screening and early detection of ear infections.

The training of para-professionals to provide community ear screening and support parents access health professionals for treatment is a unique approach providing a valued linkage between health and early learning sectors.



PLAYCLUB

Playclub is a stepping stone from playgroup to kindergarten providing a hub for families to meet prior to their children first attending school. It promotes a learning environment and social connection for children and parents. Yangebup Family Centre support Playclub at three locations including in partnership with South Coogee Primary School.

"Each year we invite our prospective Kindergarten students to attend this program to help the children to become familiar with a school environment. For the children that have participated in the program it has allowed them to develop friendships with their new classmates, and for their parents to also foster relationships with each other." FIRST AID WORKSHOP

City of Cockburn hosted a 2 ½ hour first aid workshop for parents of young children in November. 80 parents attended, including 30 dads. The content of the First Aid Workshop is a must for all parents.

After attending a First Aid course last year mum Tracey didn't expect to use the skills she had learnt. Her infant had a silent choking episode three days later and she had the courage to respond quickly and confidently. Her daughter responded and all was well.

"It was a fantastic session. All of the content was very relevant for caring for my children". Parent.

PUPPET PLAY DAY

To celebrate Children's Week in October 2019, Meerilinga Children and Family Centre, Cockburn partnered with Spare Parts Theatre and Healthways to provide a fun and free activity for children and families – Puppet Play Day.

Families were invited along to make puppets using recycled and waste materials. Families were offered a healthy "Go for 2 and 5" morning tea, sponsored by Healthways. Children's Week WA Ambassador Fairy Queen Caroline entertained the children with songs, games and storytelling. 38 families attended.
